Strong pitching combined with solid defense helped the Aeros hold off the Bay Sox until the final out. Jay Meyers, Murray Fein, Doug Kahn, Frank Borelli, Jim Noble, along with Stevens, Wolfgang, and Cosart, contributed to the Aeros 8-hit performance.
